
Herman Gamboa and all other PDGs.

K.R. "Ravi" Ravindran is CEO and founder of a publicly listed company with a worldwide clientele in the tea packaging industry. His company, Printcare Plc, is the winner of national and international awards of

excellence. He also serves on the board of several other companies and charitable trusts. He is the founding president of the Sri Lanka Anti-Narcotics Association.

A Rotarian since 1974, Ravindran has served RI as treasurer; director; Foundation trustee; committee member, vice chair, and chair; task force member; RI training leader; and district governor.

As his country's national PolioPlus chair, Ravindran headed a task force consisting of the government, UNICEF, and Rotary and worked closely with UNICEF to successfully negotiate a ceasefire with the northern militants during National Immunization Days. He also chaired the Schools Reawakening project, sponsored by Rotary clubs and districts in Sri Lanka, to rebuild 25 tsunami-devastated schools to benefit 15,000 children.

### PDG ROLANDO "OYAN" VILLANUEVA

Oyan received his medical technology degree from the Loma Linda University of California coupled with specialized courses from the University of California at Riverside and the San Bernardino Valley College; he eventually earned his masters' degree from the Asian Institute of Management in Makati, Philippines. He manages among others: a hotel and a realty company of dormitories, apartments and buildings covering the areas of Baguio, Makati, Quezon City, Malabon and Talavera; five Pilipinas Shell gas stations; wine and liquor distribution; and an Italian coffee and espresso machine importing and distribution company.

He also serves as Treasurer for the Sagip Kapatid Foundation, a Trustee of the Fernando-Rosa Bautista Foundation of the University of Baguio, Brent Baguio School International, Baguio

Heritage Foundation, Board Member of the Baguio City Council for the Boy Scouts of the Philippines, a Host Parent of the Philippine Military Academy, a Director of the Philippine National Red Cross Baguio, a member of both the Baguio Association of Restaurants and the Baguio Association of Hotels and Inns, a past national president of the Association of Pilipinas Shell Dealers Inc., Vice Chair of the Regional Advisory Group for the Philippine National Police for the Cordillera Region.

In Rotary International, he currently serves as the Regional Rotary Coordinator for the countries of the Philippines and Indonesia which covers Zone 7A for Rotary years 2012 – 2015 after having served as Assistant Rotary Coordinator for Rotary Year 2011 - 2012. He also served as the Rotary International President Representative for the District Conference of District 3300 in Malaysia last 2013. Served as training facilitator for the Governor Elect Training Seminars in Zone Institutes. Breakout speaker during the Rotary International Conventions in Bangkok, Thailand in 2012 and Sydney, Australia in 2014. Chief Guest of the President Elect Training Seminar of RI District 3201 in Coimbatore, India in 2013. His Governorship for RY 2009-2010 was a result of years of service under the Rotary Club of Baguio Summer Capital (RCBSC) where he was inducted in 1999. He served in various home club positions (presidency RY 2004- 2005, directorship and team leader/ project coordinator for RCBSC), he correspondingly held other positions in the District level. Among such responsibilities were: Chairmanship for Public Relations for D3790, Chairperson for DISCON 2007 and DISTAS 2006, Cluster Chairperson for International Service and the Rotary Foundation and Executive Secretary for the Philippine Rotary Forum. He is presently a major donor level 1of the Rotary Foundation. His home club, for its part, enjoys the distinction of being the First 100% PHF Club in District 3790.

### **SENSORY ANALYTICS, ANYONE?**

That's what their company, Statecraft Asia Ventures Inc. (SAVI) does. Five young ladies, led by a Rotarian Past President, presented the extraordinarily wide range of services provided to government and commercial organizations by this multinational US-based company now well established in the Philippines. RCMN's lunchtime meeting at the Tower Club was well attended and we all behaved ourselves in the absence of Pres. George, said to be in Boracay.

PP Dieter Brueckner moderated as usual and kept us amused as usual, informing the guest speaker ladies that we are an all-male club and that our membership includes several bachelors. Chito Frondoso reminded us that we are hosting a joint meeting on September 10th at which Rotary membership guru PDG Oyan Villanueva will help us to "Win the Battle of (Rotary Membership) Relevance" and urged maximum attendance. We welcomed back IPP Chris Bellinger who reminded us of Michelle's MMQ 'Murder Mystery' theater presentation that Saturday September 6 at the Dusit Thani hotel.

Back to SAVI, sensory analytics, and our five lady guest speakers. "The art and science of nation building" is what sensory analytics is applied to, according to the calling card of Ms. Cathy Anupol, the only guest speaker shown in 'Ang Magiting' that day. Cathy is new to SAVI, having joined the company this year as a Senior Partner after seven years as a Professional Healthcare Representative with two pharmaceutical companies. Cathy concentrated her presentation on the CSR and job placement activities (mostly OFWs) of SAVI through their subsidiary organization Placewell. The other presenters rather hesitantly covered the extraordinary scope of the logistics services that SAVI provides in the tracking of materials and supplies in many industries. In the Philippines, these and financing services can be applied to construction, land development, mining, energy and other capital-intensive industries. Internationally, SAVI's services have been applied mostly to government operations, particularly in defense logistics. On its website (www.savi.com.ph) SAVI claims that it "has currently the world's largest RFID (?) network developed in 52 countries as well as 115 patents based on the company's significant R&D investments."

Summarizing for SAVI, PP Bess Guido (RC Rizal West) linked Placewell with Rotary livelihood projects. PP Klink Ang asked about organizing a job fair in co-operation with Placewell. PP Ric dela Torre said that it might help to talk to the District Governor about that. At this meeting we got only a hazy impression of what "statecraft" and "nation building" is about. Cathy A. told me that SAVI's website is being reconstructed. If you want to know more about SAVI and its influence, particularly with governments, it might be a good idea to visit that site before those amendments are made.

4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?

### **Object of Rotary**

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

**FIRST:** The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

**SECOND**: High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

**THIRD:** The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life; **FOURTH:** The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

#### FAMILY BRIEF BACKGROUND STORIES:

His family lives in a combination of tent and tarps along the highway of the Barangay Bislig, Tanuan. He lost his sight for some time due to dynamite fishing and lost his ability to work, while his wife Carmelita is asthmatic and often very sickly. They have two children, one is mentally challenged due to stress and what the family believed to be

another cause is during her menstrual period she took a bath in the sea that led to her condition. While the other child a teenager helps the family to earn by working as a helper in a boat that acquires/ collects sand for an engineer whose business is in construction.

#### **Roberto Cena**

He is the best carpenter in the Barangay but after the Typhoon



Yolanda struck what was left of his house is the floor! He is the one who helps and assists the repair of all Batch 1 beneficiaries. We often call him the "carpenter without a house"



#### Pater Solitario Jr.

Is a fisher man helper who earns a living by driving a pedicab before Typhoon Yolanda. When the typhoon washed away their source of living. He then hired himself as a fisherman helper to support his family.

#### **Danilo Armateo**

Is a widow man since 2001 and has three (3) children. He got stroke and was partially disabled. His daughter wasn't able to continue her studies due to family needs.

#### **Rex Cayubit**

Rex Cayubit and his family lives along the highway with his three (3) children and works as a fisherman helper by dawn and pedicab driver by day to makes end meet for the family.

#### **Reynaldo Lerios**

A father to four children, Reynaldo makes a living by doing to the sea to catch fish or by trading the fish caught by fishermen friends. He dries it up and packed it and sell it to provide for his family and his two grandchildren. He







earns below US\$1 per day to provide for the entire family.

#### **Ruben Dazo**

Father of 5 children (3 boys, 2 girls), Ruben provides for the family by doing pedicab driving while his eldest help the family by doing manicure to neighbors to make ends meet. While his wife stays at home as a housewife.

#### **Ricky Palana**

Is the eldest among four siblings, they were

already orphaned and lived in the house of old neighbors whom they also help in any household labor prior to Super Typhoon Yolanda and their situation was aggravated more by the destruction left by the typhoon. Ricky earns a living as a fisherman helper and/or at times as a pedicab driver in the community. He also earns less than US\$ 1 per day.
